

Dr. Aphichat Chamratrithirong is Emeritus Professor and currently Adviser at Institute for Population and Social Research (IPSR), Mahidol University, Thailand. He received Rockefeller scholarship and earned Ph.D. degree in Sociology (Demography) from Brown University in 1976. He worked at IPSR during 1976-1998 and 2003-present, and served as IPSR Director 1989-1996. He was President of Thailand's Population Association during 1991-1994. From 1998 to 2003, at United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP) he worked as Regional Adviser on Population Census and Survey Data Analysis, in the UNFPA Country Technical Services Team for East and South-East Asia. He returned to Mahidol University in 2003. During 2005-2011, he served as Member of the Specialist Panel for Social Science and Operations Research on Sexual and Reproductive Health, WHO. He was founder of Mahidol Migration Center and served as its Director from 2010 to 2018. He was among the founders and Council Member and Treasurer of Asian Population Association between 2008 and 2010. In 2012 Dr. Aphichat was awarded the title of "National Distinguished Researcher" (Sociology) from the National Research Council of Thailand. During 2012-2016, he was Member of the Executive Board of the National Research Council of Thailand and Chairman of the Committee of Sociology. Since 2022 he was Adviser to "Mahidol University Committee on Research Policy and Monitoring". Dr Aphichat published more than 100 articles in the fields of population, fertility, family planning, migration, adolescent reproductive health, family relations, HIV/AIDS program prevention, nutritional behavior and related health and social researches.
